## Allen writes his German girlfriend after returning to the United States:

"30/April/46/

I promised you I would write you just as soon as I arrived in the states...Honey I am so much lonely from being from you that every nite I have 1 to 2 dreams & what dreams they are...Do you have that same kind of dream about me. Darling I am starting back to you my beautiful courageous wife to be in September no later...How would you like that...promise you will give me a child just as soon as nature can work for us I mean as soon as I arrive at your home with the engagement ring & the wedding ring you and I shall be married by civilian papers until my government will allow us to do it legally. I am sending you some extra stamps I had left over.

your true lover,
Allen"

## Allen writes his German girlfriend again after returning to the United States:

"May 12, 46.

Darling have you received my letter which I wrote you. I wrote you the very first day I hit the states...I haven't as yet found the book on deutch-english but will find it & send you & your son as soon as possible...I'll never be satisfied till you & I are side by side once more. I must close.
