The U.S. Army sends a telegram to Paul's father in the United States:

“WASHINGTON D C 6/16/44

REGRET TO INFORM YOU YOUR SON WAS ON XX MAY SERIOUSLY WOUNDED IN ACTION
IN ITALY PERIOD MAIL ADDRESS FOLLOWS YOU WILL BE ADVISED AS REPORTS OR
CONDITION ARE RECEIVED.

ULIO THE ADJUTANT GENERAL”
